

Community Outreach

Workforce development and community outreach was a focus for the association in 2025.

We reached out to potential sponsors, and school shop classes to promote an event that would embrace our core values. With the help of sponsors we were able to bring in \$15,000 in materials and monetary awards to the schools.

We had three high schools participate in the event this year- Hutchison High School, Lathrop High School and North Pole High School. Between all of the schools we had 11 dog houses built and showcased at the IABA Home Show.

A large portion of the materials were donated by Spenard Builders Supply and delivered to the schools. Additional materials were donated by Rivers Wood Products, Intella Homes, Seamless Supply and Sherwin Williams. The only requirement was that the dog houses were no bigger than 3'x5' in size.

IABA Builder Members went to the schools to talk about their experience as a builder and to promote the trades.

Mt. McKinley Bank sponsored a prize of \$1500 to the shop class that drew in the most money, this award went to North Pole High School. The People's Choice Award was sponsored by AIH and awarded to Hutchison High School for having the most votes from Home Show attendees. We had about 4500 people attend the Home Show.

Ventilation Solutions sponsored much of the marketing materials and the door prizes for those participating in the event.

We could not have done this event with out the sponsors and the work of IABA President Brannon Richart who coordinated much of the logistics to make this event a success.
